Home Learning

Thank you for your most diligent and successful efforts in supporting students through their home learning. I trust you and your child are now settling into the rhythm and routine of our new way of working in the same way that we are as staff. As stated last week in my letter, it goes without saying that as parents and carers you are fully supported by the Academy to make decisions on how the day is structured for your child and if at any point you feel they are doing too much work or spending too much time on the home learning, then you can make the decision to reduce some of the work to alleviate the pressure. The flexibility is there for you to include activities such as cooking, gardening, cleaning, family exercise/walk and other essential life skills to break up and vary the day. There will be no new home learning set over the Easter holiday so your child may wish to use some of this time to catch up any tasks or learning which they have not completed or alternatively try the "Pembroke Easter Challenges". Teachers are doing an absolutely fantastic job of setting meaningful, challenging and plentiful home learning. Many are emailing their students at their school email account to clarify work set, offer advice and words of encouragement and many students are interacting, responding and communicating with their teachers successfully. Please remind your child to check their school email account daily so that they do not miss out on what is often additional clarity of the work and an opportunity to touch base with their teacher and seek advice.
