If you arrive by bus or car, you will be dropped off in front of the sports hall

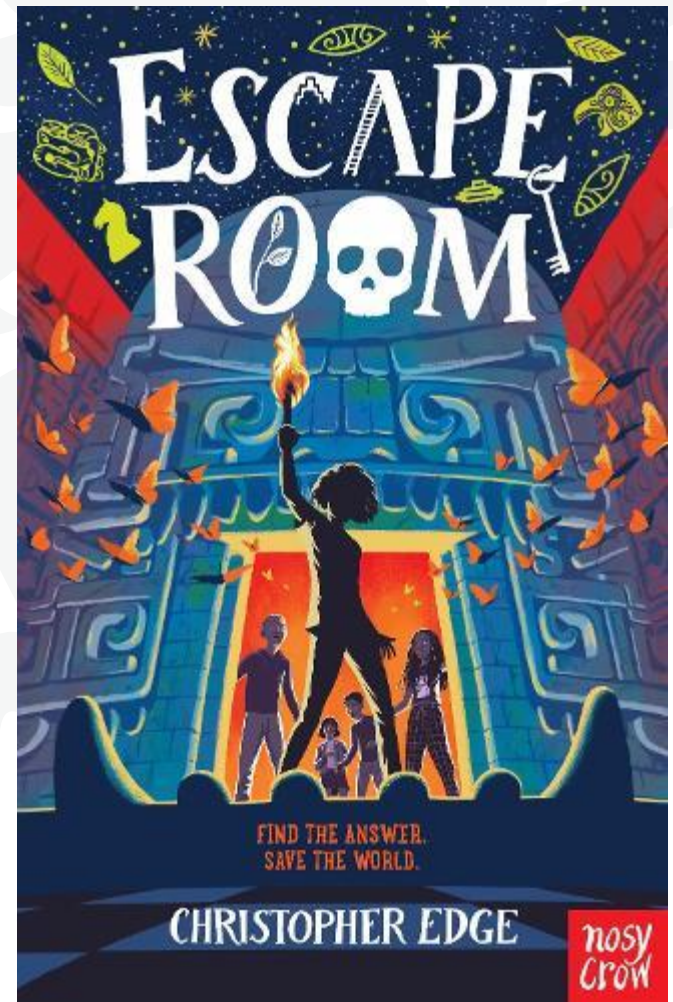

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



We appreciate that not all children will be ready to complete all the below challenges yet. However, we would like to encourage everyone to have a go at these tasks in order to ensure that your transition into year 7 life, as well as your lessons, are as worry free as possible.

 Remember a parent's phone number by heart.	
 Iron a shirt.	
 Make change from £1, £2, £5, and £10.	
 Read a basic plan or plan (e.g., of a shopping centre or theme park)	
 Tell the time on an analogue clock.	
 Get fully dressed in 5 minutes or less.	
 Write down your full home address, including your postcode.	
 Put on your own shoes and socks and tie your shoelaces.	
 Make a healthy packed lunch and eat it in 15 minutes. Don't forget water!	

	Brush your own hair, and if long, put it up. Try out different hairstyles too!	
	Count up in 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 10s. Challenge yourself to do other numbers too!	
	Set the time on an alarm clock or mobile phone.	
	Get in and out of your PE kit as quickly as you can. Try to make sure the items are the right way round!	
	Make a cup of tea.	
	Attach a document to an email and send it to a parent or teacher.	
	Accurately measure 10cm, 35cm, 150mm, 500ml and 200g.	
	If you are going to walk to school: Can you walk the route safely by yourself? Time yourself doing it, then add at least 5 minutes to the journey. <i>What time will you have to leave to get there early?</i>	
	If you are going to catch a bus to school: Can you find out what time the bus leaves, and from which stop? How long will it take you to walk to the bus stop? Add at least 5 minutes to the journey. <i>What time will you have to leave to get there early?</i>	
	Plan or make a ' What if Wallet ', with your home contact details, bus ticket, emergency money and a secret smile object (a small photo, shell, keyring, pet rock or note that makes you feel calm and positive, whatever your day brings). Decide where you will keep it in your new uniform or bag.

Your planner has allocated spaces for subject stamps to be issued for the following reasons.

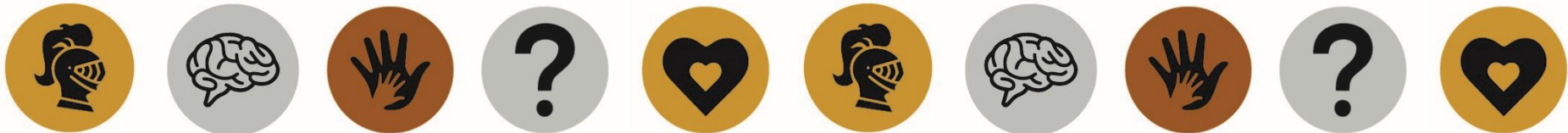
Curiosity → You ask an insightful question or challenge the teacher with your curiosity.

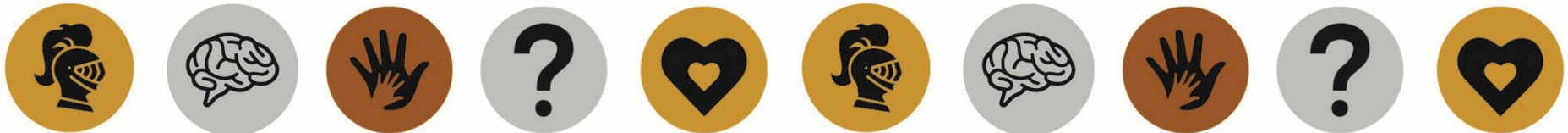

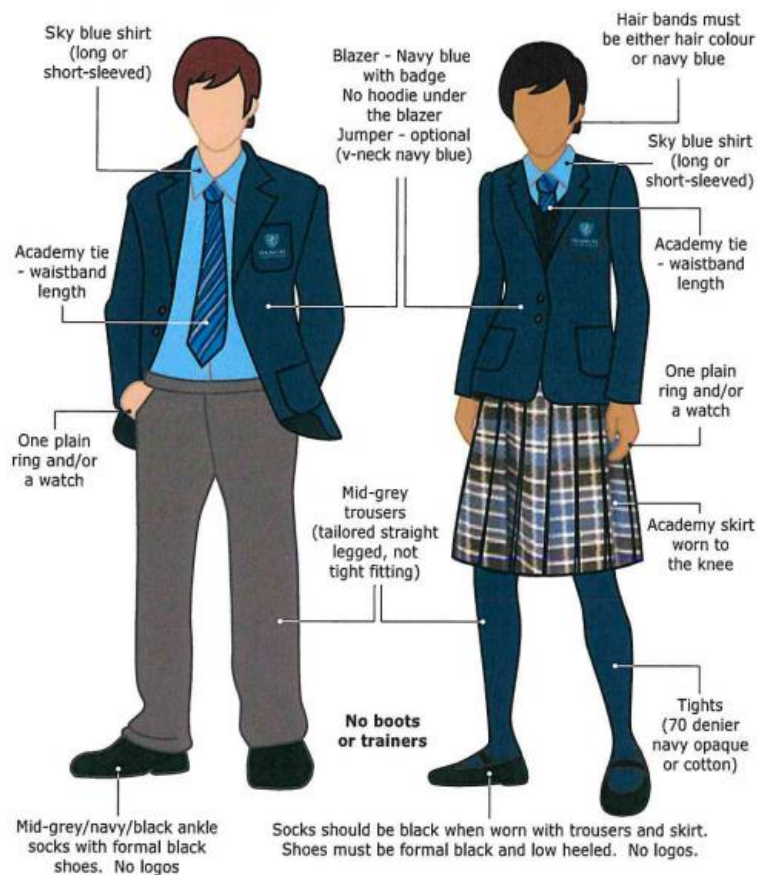
