Dear Parents/Carers

As Head of Year 7, I am writing a short letter to introduce myself to you at this early stage of the new academic year. My name is Miss Whelan and I look forward to a successful year with our students and yourselves.

As we approach half-term, I have to say how pleased I am with the way that Year 7 have settled into their new timetable and new routines. It was pleasing to see how many Year 7 students generously gave up their time to support at the Academy open Evening showing how passionate they are about our school. During lessons and extracurricular activities, it has been excellent to see students following our school rules 'be ready, be safe, be respectful' and truly embedding the school values passion, generosity, curiosity, courage and wisdom in everything they do.

Uniform

It is pleasing to see the vast majority of our students wearing the Pembroke uniform with pride. We have high standards of uniform and make no apologies for this. Many visitors to the school and members of the local community comment on how smart our students are. We believe that if a student looks smart, they feel smart, and therefore work smart!

I would like to point parents and students in the direction of the uniform policy published on our website and in the student planner on page 11 (the PE uniform is detailed on page 12). In particular please be aware that trousers should be straight, classic style; jewellery is limited to one pair of plain stud earrings and one finger ring; a watch can be worn around the wrist. We will work with students and parents to ensure uniform worn meets our expectations. If there are any queries regarding this please feel free to get in touch.

Recording behaviours to support learning

At Pembroke we have always had an ethos of celebrating positive behaviours, and we do this through stamps in the planner, Hot Chocolate Friday, positive phone calls home, Value Postcards and celebration assemblies at the end of modules, as well as many, many more means. I urge parents to go through the planner at least once a week with their child, signing where indicated, and celebrate the successes. Experience has taught us that this is an effective method of understanding 'what goes on' at school.

More recently staff and students at Pembroke have had a voice in reviewing and refining how we deal with disruption to learning, also known as 'low-level disruption'. We have introduced a more comprehensive method of recording low-level disruption, to support our strategies to tackle this. As our behaviour policy states: "*all*

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students have the right to learn; all teachers have the right to teach". This, coupled with our three rules of Be Ready, Be Safe and Be Respectful, are a driving force behind our work in this area.

Our aim is for all students, teachers and parents to see a benefit within lessons and learning. The vast majority of parents will see no difference in our recording of behaviours, as we know the vast majority of our students are Ready, Safe and Respectful in all areas of Pembroke life. However, staff are recording disruption to lessons, including when a student has needed to be removed, and this data will inform conversations with students and parents in order to find the right support to improve behaviours where necessary.
