There have been many opportunities for Pembroke students to expand their cultural horizons with visits to London to see a fantastic Body Worlds exhibition and a trip to Nottingham for a theatre production of Blood Brothers to enhance the GCSE drama students' understanding of the play. Our students have shown passion working hard over the past few months to take part in a Magistrates Court Mock Trial and four students competed in the English Speaking Union's Public Speaking event, with Hannah Fox being awarded "Best Chairperson". These are important on many levels, not just to track progress but also to allow students to learn the process and rules of examinations and to practise preparing for the real thing. Further to the idea of preparing for the future our Year 11 students also took part in a mock interview day. It was pleasing to see how they prepared for their interviews, dressing professionally and conducting themselves well. The feedback from the outside agencies that conducted the interviews was very good.
