

July 2020 – End of Year Letter

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of our third year of The Priory Pembroke Academy, it is a good time to reflect on what we have achieved, update you on some important changes and look forward to a successful 2020-2021.

We have had the most surreal time over the last few months. Where school should have been full and busy, it has been the complete opposite. But saying this, the COVID-19 situation has really shown what a wonderful school we have here at Pembroke. I would like to pay a personal tribute to all of the Pembroke staff. In time, we will look back and reflect on what we have achieved during these unprecedented times. There are so many positives to be proud of: committed and passionate members of Pembroke staff; moral purpose by everyone, in buckets; a real, genuine love of Pembroke and its community; a coming together of all staff, students and parents, we have been very much in this together; an ability to navigate chaos and difficulty; resilience that none of us thought we had and an opportunity to build relationships with each other in a unique way. I am sure there are more that we will find in hindsight.

The Curriculum

We continue to make big strides with our curriculum. We maintain a five-year pathway where students specialise in Year 10 and 11. Our mission continues: to improve the life chances of our pupils so that they become true citizens of the world. Our curriculum seeks to develop academic capital, cultural capital, social capital and creative capital. I really do hope that you are seeing your child grow and develop in these areas. We have had another successful year of reading with hundreds of books being loaned out. We now have children reading that had previously fallen out of love with books and this is an area we are so proud of. Over lockdown, reading continues to be strong with read-along sessions

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with Mrs Coggan each week. This is helped by the encouragement of parents and passion of our students. Long may this reading success continue. As Jacqueline Kennedy once said, 'There are many little ways to enlarge your child's world. Love of books is the best of all.'

Learning environment

As part of our drive for improvement, we continue to freshen the school on a yearly basis and invest. Last summer, we invested significantly into new classroom furniture. Over these summer months, parts of the school will be redecorated. We are also putting new keyboards and computers in the newly decorated music room. We are also having more new furniture in the canteen area and several classrooms. You will also notice that we are upgrading to a brand new state-of-the-art 3G pitch. All of these investments will enhance the learning environment for our students.

<u>September 2020 – COVID Operating Procedures</u>

Below is a summary of the operating procedures for September. We are going to produce a more comprehensive document to support transition back to school. This will be published no later than 20th August.

Bubbles

Due to the size of the school, we will have two unique bubbles. Within the bubbles, classes will remain constant. For example, 8.1 is in 'Bubble A' but will stay together as a class for every lesson.

For the upper school, classes will mix for option subjects.



Buses

School transport will run to the times that have always been. School transport is operated by LCC and we have little control in this area. They will update us over the summer on the procedures for September 2020. If you have any questions, please contact them through the LCC website.

Break/Lunchtimes

The Pembroke Diner will be open from September 2020. The menu will be reduced. We are encouraging students to bring in a pack up, which includes a drink.

Equipment

The DFE guidance states that we should be limiting the amount of sharing of equipment. We ask that all students add the following materials to their pencil case: glue stick, eraser and a pair of safety scissors.

Hygiene & Rules

It is important that everyone follows the new procedures. The below are additions we all need to note for September 2020.

Student procedures when in school

The following procedures must be followed by all students when on the Pembroke Academy site, both inside and outside the buildings.



Wash your hands regularly or use hand sanitiser. Germs are carried by your hands. Wash them with soap and water when you arrive to school, before and after you eat, when you leave school and before and after using equipment (e.g. sports equipment).



2. Catch It, Bin It, Kill It. Coughs and sneezes spread diseases! Make sure you cough or sneeze into a tissue, throw it in the bin, and wash your hands. If you do not have a tissue, cough or sneeze into the inside of your elbow.



Maintain social distancing. Ensure there is a space between yourself and anybody else at all times where possible. Follow the guidelines.



4. Use the same work area. Use the same computer all the time and sit in the same seat in your classroom. Moving your work area increases the chance of germs spreading.



5. Keep your work area neat and tidy. This is essential in order to clean it effectively.



6. Only use your own stationery. Do not borrow someone else's ruler, pencil sharpener or anything else. This is to stop spreading germs.



7. Stick to your zone. Follow staff instructions on where you are allowed to go. Make sure you stay in your area.

School Day

The school day will operate as normal: 0840 to 1505. Students need to go to the form rooms by 0840. Form rooms are in zoned areas. Students in school before 0840 will be directed to certain areas of the school to wait.

All students will have 5 lessons a day but will have staggered lessons and breaks.

Practical Lessons
