Technology -Timber	<p>BBC Bitsize Daily lesson- Designing and building for the future. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zbtq2sg</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Read through the information and watch the videos provided on Smart, composite and modern materials. Then carry out the Activity 1 quiz. 2) Activity 2- How can we take a traditional material, such as paper, and improve its strength at home? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Build a bridge made of paper by placing a piece of paper between two objects of the same height around 25 cm apart - this could be across the edge of two chairs, two books or even two toilet roll tubes. • The paper will curve in the centre even without any additional weight - the challenge is to get paper to support the heaviest weight possible. • Experiment with different folds and layers: <p>Write a paragraph response for each question below.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What happens when you fold the paper back and forth like a fan? • What happens when you layer pieces of paper on top of each other? • What happens when you weave pieces of paper in and out of each other? • By experimenting in this way, you should start to understand where the ideas for modern material developments were formed. <p>You will need several pieces of paper and items of various weights, as well as two identical objects for the pillars of your bridge. Take pictures of each task as you carry them out as evidence.</p>
Food Technology	<p>Design and conduct an experiment to show how chemical raising agents work – you should use baking powder and/or bicarbonate of soda in your experiment. Can you show with diagrams or a physical experiment how it works and what it does. Include pictures and use technical terminology to help explain what happens. Submit it as a report to gbaker@prioryacademies.co.uk (if possible) on no more than 2 sides of A4.
