- 1. Research the context around your theme (like background information for your chosen theme) **include pictures where possible** e.g. Climate emergency, Cinemas and coast. Some ideas to start you off below:
 - Cinemas: Location What do they look like (key features)? What products/objects might you find there?
 Who is the target market (groups of people and age range of the people who use these)? What sort of colour schemes might you associate with the cinema? Cinema brands?
 - **Coast**: What are the key features of the coast? What might you find there? What products/objects are associated with the coast? Who is the target market (groups of people and age range of the people who use these)? What sort of colour schemes might you associate with the coast?
 - Climate emergency: What is the climate emergency? What will happen if this continues? What is causing it? Who or what will be most impacted? What main charities or organisations are associated and what do they do?
- 2. Include research (and pictures) about your chosen contextual challenge what is already being done to
 - Raise awareness of the climate emergency
 - promote a more sustainable lifestyle
 - encourage people to visit the cinema
 - · improve the experience of people at the cinema
 - preserve wildlife in coastal areas
 - stay safe at the coast
- 3. Reverse the question and go into **detail** with the below in **full sentences** (explain clearly).
 - Why are people not aware of the climate emergency?
 - What factors prevent a more sustainable lifestyle and why?
 - Why are people not visiting the cinema? (streaming sites Netflix, Prime, Disney+ etc.)
 - What are the possible issues with the current cinema experience?
 - What are the hazards for wild life in coastal areas?
 - What are the hazards (why are people not safe) at the coast?

You will need to login at the top right hand corner of the page. I have sent you all an email with your username. Please use the same username as the password also (you can change this password once you are logged in). Once logged in:

- Click on 'courses' at the top of the page
- Click on the image of the performer holding their leg

On the right hand side you will see the titles of each LO section of the exam. Here you can choose which areas of the exam you'd like to improve on most.

- 1) Choose a Learning Objective and click on it.
- 2) Choose a Sub-topic and click on it.
- 3) Complete the multiple choice quiz first (you will be given a score and a percentage, and you can also complete each quiz as many times as you like to try and beat your previous score. You will also be able to see a mini certificate when you have got a score equal to or higher than the pass mark. I will then be able to see when you did the quiz and what score you got.
- 4) Once you have completed the quiz for that sub topic, then complete the 8 mark question. For the 8 mark question, firstly watch the video (as we have done before in lesson) and this will help you to remember the content needed to answer the question. Then answer the question either on Microsoft Word. You may send me this to mark once you have completed the question!
