Year 10

- Discussing key skills needed for various jobs;
- Careers fair to introduce the students to the variety of careers available;
- Work inspiration preparation to help gain individual experiences of the workplace
- START programme.
- Future You and careers sessions during form time.

Year 11

Prepare students for transition to post-16 destinations

- Advice on how to make the most of the facilities in the Careers Zone;
- Introduction to options at 16+ and 18+;
- Using the STEPS booklets to develop career and opportunity awareness through written exercises
- Forward planning for the year as a whole, with a view to making 16+ decisions, including an introduction to a sixth form;
- Presentations on 'Post 16 decisions linked to career choices', including presentations from local college, Sixth Form and apprenticeship options;
- START programme.
- Future You and careers sessions during form time.
