

Year 9 Independent Study Plan 2. Week Beginning 30/03/2020

Home learning is different to learning in school. You will need to plan your time carefully to make sure you are able to complete the work, but also do other hobbies you enjoy safely in your home. If you don't have hobbies that can be done at home, this is the perfect time to learn how to play the guitar that is gathering dust in the corner or learn a new language, or create a training circuit in the garden.

When planning your home learning, a good idea is to complete a task set by the subjects you have on your timetable each day; so if you have Maths, History, Science, Art and Music on Monday, they would be the focus of your work for that day. We also recommend that you read every day; a comic, a magazine, a chapter or a full book!

You should continue to demonstrate an excellent attitude to your learning by attempting all tasks to a good standard. If you need help or have completed work please email your subject teacher if possible. If this is not possible, please keep your work together ready to show staff when school reopens.

New home learning tasks will be added to sharepoint by subjects each week. This overview document will be published every Monday to signpost you to the tasks, but you can start them as soon as they are posted by your teacher. This document will also include the previous week's work so that you can check you are up to date before starting a new task.

| English | <p>Complete the booklet on gothic literature (copies can be downloaded from the English Sharepoint Page ready for when we return. You should be spending at least 3 hours per week on this work, completing the tasks in detail.</p> <p>When the booklet has been completed to a good standard and sent to your teacher, go to Section Two open the KS3 independent Study-Y9 document and complete the tasks on the sheet. You should aim to do 3-4 tasks per week. You should spend one hour on each task. When you complete a task, send it to your teacher for marking.</p> <p>The English Literature GCSE includes the study of The Christmas Carol. Please read the book to prepare for this study. | Drama | <p>Task 1 – Live Theatre Evaluation Please log onto BCC iPlayer. (you will need an account in order to watch, however they are completely free to create, and your household must have a TV license). You are to watch 2 different episodes from ‘The Goes Wrong Show’. For each episode, you are to complete the questions outlined in the booklet, reviewing the performance.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What have they done well? - What could they do to improve the performance if they were to create it again? - Explain in detail how comedy has been created for an audience. - Identify the different physical movements that have been used and how they are effective for the performance being created. <p>Task 2 – The Imp Trail ‘Visual Storytelling’. You are to research the legend of the Lincoln Imp – as outlines in Mrs Warnock’s assembly. Using this, you are to come up with a short story that can be turned into a performance / piece of script, demonstrating an area of originality.</p> <p>Task 3 – Pre GCSE Prep Listen to the Blood Brothers soundtrack on Spotify / YouTube / Apple Music. After listening to the soundtrack, look at an overview of the story and put together a storyboard for the play.</p> <p>Task 4 - Students are to choose three of the five activities. Students should be aiming to spend around 30 minutes on each activity.</p> <p>Students are reminded that there is already work on SharePoint that they should be working through too.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Write a one page monologue from YOUR perspective on how “social distancing” affects you. <input type="checkbox"/> If there was a play written about what is going on in the world right now, what would the TITLE be? Draw a poster that would be used to advertise it. (You must include the title, key information and any names of people starring in the performance). <input type="checkbox"/> Choose your favourite character from a movie or TV show. Create a Venn diagram to show the similarities between the characters and yourself. <input type="checkbox"/> Create a positivity collage. Include inspirational quotes, pictures that make you happy, song lyrics, things that inspire you, drawings, etc. You should cover 100% of the page. <input type="checkbox"/> Choose a movie that you have seen recently and create a review of it. You should highlight the areas that worked well, explaining how and why these areas were effective. You should also highlight areas for improvement, explaining in detail how it could be improved and why. <p>All completed work must be emailed over to rlawson@poryacadmies.co.uk – this includes the story ideas for your visual story (Even if you don’t necessarily want to perform / feature in the piece).</p> |

| History | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Revise Crime and Punishment topic 1 (1000-1500, Medieval period) using page 2-9 of the work book. A Copy of the workbook is available on the History Sharepoint page, Year 9 Crime and Punishment folder. Additional revision materials can be found in the GCSE folder 2. Using page 10-19 complete pre-learning tasks for topic 2 (1500-1700, Early Modern Period). 3. Watch Tony Robinson’s Crime and Punishment Episode 2, and complete the task sheet to support your revision (full episode on youtube). 4. Case Study task – The Gunpowder Plot. Watch https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KtRuIH7INc4 and make a set of notes on the causes of the plot, the trial and punishment of the plotters, and then explain why the plotters were punished so harshly. Use Histrionics Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EMLHau_rBJ8 to add extra detail to your notes. 5. Case Study task – Witch Trials and Matthew Hopkins. Watch https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rm9-WSYNzF0 and create a set of notes to summarise the causes of the rise in witch trials, the work of Matthew Hopkins, the trials and punishments of ‘witches’, and then explain why witches were punished so harshly. | Art | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Explore the 'rules of composition' in terms of photography and take a photo to show each rule – present these as a ppt and annotate each one explaining the rules. (7 Rules are: fill the frame, creative framing, rule of thirds, leading lines, foreground & depth, odd numbers, contrasting colours) 2. If you opt for photography – your first project will be the Alphabet project – google this and have a go at it with objects inside and outside your house which resemble the letter forms of the English alphabet. Save these onto a ppt and your phone/camera because you can use these in year 10 if you do opt. Using ppt – shrink your photo's and spell the school value words with them. If you can edit them using an app (such as Adobe photoshop express) then you can add filters too and have a play with the effects. 3. Complete the 30 day drawing challenge for year 9 (attached). <p>Photoshop Wiz workshop which was put onto the news page of the website last week. All images needed and handouts with instructions are on Sharepoint and all students can access Adobe Photoshop through Citrix. It's in the Citrix Applications folder, alternatively search for it in the search bar. I recommend working through these twice to embed the tools and memory and then you can try and create your own surreal image like some of those on the handouts.</p> <p>https://theartyteacher.com/what-can-i-draw/ - 100 things to draw – again all students can be completing at least 1 drawing per week which should take 1 hour. | Food Tech | <p>Complete the Year 9 Home Learning task on the Technology Sharepoint page</p> <p>Other suggested activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a PowerPoint presentation or set of posters about the importance of health and safety and food hygiene. Make sure you research the key facts. • Design a meal for a family that increases the amount of dietary fibre and fruits and vegetables. You should aim to do a main course dish and a desert. Try to keep the amount of fats as low as possible. Collect together recipes and methods for your chosen dishes. • Create a word search on kitchen equipment, food safety and health and hygiene. You could send this out to your friends to have a go at. • Design a poster for a new government healthy eating campaign.
